## 21st Jan. 2022.

On November 9th 2021 our Divisional Inspector carried out a 'Supporting the Safe Provision of Schooling Inspection'. This inspection covered our Child Protection obligations and Policy and our Covid-19 Safe Schooling Policy. The Inspectorate subsequently issued their report, which I am glad to say was excellent. IXL is designed to help your child learn at their own pace. The programme is adaptive and will adjust based on your child's demonstrated understanding of the material. All of your child's results will be saved, so you can monitor their progress anytime by clicking on Analytics. For the on-the-go practice, you can download IXL's free mobile apps for Apple, Android or Kindle and sign in with your child's username and password.
